
The New Normal and Your Wastewater System

How to improve the stress on your system:

- Make sure that you are spacing out the water usage throughout the day and the week. Your system needs a full 24 hours to process the water that you put in everyday.
- Do not use harsh chemicals when cleaning. This will also kill the bacteria in your system.
- Use bar soaps instead of liquid soaps.
- Limit the use of your garbage disposal and avoid flushing chemicals or medicine down the toilet.
- Monitor your sludge level in your tank. When inconsistent water usage happens it can push the solids and sludge into areas that may cause clogs and backups.
- Check your drain field to make sure that it is not becoming soggy and is able to handle the drainage.
